From the Committee

Ward Committee. The Chairman was part of a tour by representatives from all the towns including the Councillors from Wards 9 and 10 on a visit to municipal works and installations starting at the waste disposal depot at Karwyderskraal and ending at the Buffels Dam.

Crime over the last month has increased quite dramatically despite all our efforts by our Neighbourhood Watch to curtail the crime rate. There were no less than eleven (11) incidents during the course of only one week. There were housebreakings where TV's, Laptops, Cameras and Wallets were stolen. More disturbing were the theft of five (5) firearms from homes. There were also many incidents of theft out of vehicles where cameras, wallets, cellphones, etc, were stolen.

The majority of these cases can easily be described as shear negligence on the part of the owners especially when valuables are left in vehicles which in some cases were left unlocked. The damage to vehicles often far exceeds the value of the items stolen.

The message of securing valuables and securing ones homes from unlawful access is not getting through to our residents. Far too many incidents over the last couple of weeks involve the failure of occupants to adhere to simple precautionary measures of securing their properties. Far too many people are entertaining elsewhere on their properties whilst doors and windows are either left open or unlocked. Residents need to take more responsibility for the safety of their properties. Firearms have to be kept under lock and key and not in handbags, bedside drawers or in unlocked safes. Owners who fail to secure their firearms could also possibly face prosecution. Far too many residents retire for the night and leave windows open and alarms switched off. Quite a number of housebreakings are taking place whilst owners are in residence.

There have been far too many incidents of theft out of vehicles where cameras, laptops, cellphones, wallets are being left in vehicles in full view of opportunistic thieves.

Another disturbing change of events has been the number of bush fires since the beginning of the year some through the shear negligence of people who throw braai coals into the bush whilst others have been deliberately set to cause distraction so as to either break into houses or make a quick getaway with stolen goods.

Some Precautionary Measures that need to be taken:

- Be constantly on the look-out for suspicious looking characters or vehicles and do not hesitate to report them to the SAPS and/or the NW;
- Ensure that all windows can be properly locked and are burglar proofed. This will also prevent invasion by baboons;
- Never sleep with windows open unless burglar proofing is fitted, even in upper storey rooms where a window is situated near a drainpipe;
- Ensure that external doors are fitted with adequate locks;
- Never leave door keys hanging in the door;
- Don't leave spare keys lying around in your house. Place them in a safe place;
- Firearm owners must ensure that their firearms are kept safe at all times. Firearms must always be under your direct control or locked away in a firearm safe;
- Never leave ladders, scaffolding, axes and spades outside. These are potential housebreaking tools and weapons;
- Ensure that an intruder detection system is connected directly to a security company providing a 24 hour service. Ensure that the system is always activated when away from home. Ensure that the system is periodically checked and maintained and upgraded where necessary;
- When out walking always make sure that your cellphone is concealed. Never leave cellphones lying on a seat in the car;
- Be alert at all times to any strangers, perhaps disguised as workmen or vendors, who may be loitering in the neighbourhood. Also be aware of job seekers;
- Look out for suspicious vehicles that cruise the area at intervals and who may be keeping houses under observation. People and/or vehicles giving rise to suspicion

should be reported to the SAPS, along with the fullest possible personal and vehicle descriptions;

- Ensure that front and back doors are not left open or unlocked;
- Keep garage doors closed and locked;
- Ensure that valuable items are not left on seats in cars parked at unprotected and isolated areas. Rather keep them locked away in the boot;
- Never leave car keys in the ignition when away from the car;
- Keep a list of the make, model and serial numbers of electrical appliances and other valuable equipment should it be required for investigation purposes.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our Neighbourhood Watch Members for their continual hard work and dedication. There are patrols at all hours of the day and night, but unfortunately they cannot be everywhere. Remember to make a Neighbourhood Watch successful we need all our residents to do their share in helping to prevent crime in our beautiful coastal village.

Another star is born

Baboons Again

The undermentioned letter was addressed to the Area Manager. Cecile was due to have a meeting with those concerned in the Municipality and the Chairman of the Pringle Bay Ratepayers Association on Thursday 14 March 2013 to discuss their issues, which include the rights of property owners. After this meeting we will in turn have a meeting with them to address the issues stated hereunder and will keep you informed of progress.

<u>Cecile Jonkheid – Area Manager Overstrand Municipality – Kleinmond/Hangklip</u> <u>Bettys Bay – Baboon Problems</u>

We refer to your reply of 23 January 2013 to our reply of 15 January 2013 as well as comments made in the minutes of the Ward 10 Committee meeting of 12 February 2013 in connection with "baboon problems" in Bettys Bay.

As previously mentioned to you we are not satisfied with many of the answers supplied by you and accordingly request feedback to the following:

- 1) Drop Off Facility You have obviously not taken any notice of our suggestion in respect of improving the locking mechanism on the cage but merely state that no devices would work and that users damage the system. This is unacceptable and we require a specific reply as to why our suggestion will not work. Additionally you quote that there has been an improvement since a worker has been on site. We acknowledge this but note that on occasions the site is not attended. Why is this? We want to know precisely on what days and during what times your official will be on duty and what arrangements are in place to ensure attendance at these times.
- 2) Notices To Residents Re Usage Of Baboon Proof Bins You have stated that this is the responsibility of Denovan and that he is currently on leave until 28 January 2013 when you will take the matter up with him. You personally previously stated that notices where sent to Theo Loubser on 15 October 2012 for distribution. This is now five months ago and in our opinion is pathetic "buck passing" of a simple issue that should have happened long ago. Additionally at the last Ward Committee meeting we discussed this issue and it was suggested that a Law Enforcement Official be placed on the truck collecting refuse and issue fines in a number of cases where residents are not complying with the by law and it was not necessary to first issue notices. What and when precisely is something being done about this matter?
- 3) Lenders And Renters Of Properties Obviously you do not have a data base of these property owners but the necessary information could be included in the notice to them of their responsibility in respect of refuse disposal by those using their properties. What is being done about this?
- 4) Locking Mechanism On Baboon Proof Bins Your reply is completely unacceptable and tries to pass the responsibility on to residents. The fact is that you have sold a defective product to residents and are now abdicating your responsibility. Any other supplier would recall the product and do the necessary changes to make it effective. What are you doing about this and what is happening about future supplies with an effective locking device?
- 5) Erection Of Signs What has happened to date and what is being done to have the necessary signs manufactured and erected?

- 6) Spreading Out Of Refuse Collections What is the position of with this matter which you were taking up with the Manager Solid Waste?
- 7) Property Owners Rights Re Baboon Infestation On Their Properties You personally, Cecile undertook months ago to establish property owner's rights in dealing with baboons on their properties. Subsequently you stated that Lisel had written to Nic Vorster in this regard and that I should obtain a copy from him. I have subsequently received an E-Mail from Nic in which he states that he has received no response from you and only a "long E-Mail from our Councilor, defending the Area manager and lecturing me about "best practice" and how to determine responsibility". He in turn replied that the E-Mail was not addressed to her and that this was the last he heard on the matter. Both Nic and the BBRA would like your personal advice as to our rights in this matter as you have previously undertaken to establish.

Lastly your comments re Pringle Bay have been read with interest but as all the above are relative to the Overstrand Municipalities responsibilities and enforcement of it's by laws your comments are not relative. The only matter outside this issue is the employment of "Baboon Monitors" and you are aware of our application in this regard.

We would appreciate your prompt response to all the above matters and perhaps suggest that it would be appropriate for us as an Association to hold a meeting with you and your Operation's Manager at a mutually convenient time to go into these matters in detail due to the fact that should we address these at a Ward Committee meeting it will take up too much of the Committee's time.

The Wind bloweth...

We have been amazed, over the past few weeks, at the expressions of warmth and compassion from the people in Betty's Bay upon hearing, firstly, of the death of Pastor Danie Pretorius' wife Elsa, and secondly, the death of our beloved dog, Abby. Elsa left a huge gap in the Lakeside Chapel family, as well as the place where she worked so tirelessly to improve the plight of impoverished communities. She was known and loved for her effervescent personality, her ready laugh and the way she reached out to other people, even when she herself was suffering from a terminal cancer. Abby, only five years old, was known and loved for her gentleness with adults and children alike, her insatiable zest for life, her ever-wagging tail, and barring a mongoose, her love for all things natural. Incredibly affectionate, she lavished love upon humans, particularly our grandchildren, and was a joyful part of her sister's adopted family, who looked after her whenever we went away.

Many people travelled from all over the country to attend Elsa's memorial service, and we joined our fellow Chapel members in supporting Danie and his family in bidding farewell, and paying tribute to a dearly beloved friend and sister. Five days later we made the difficult and heartbreaking decision that the time had come for Abby, who had been suffering from kidney failure for a while, to make her final visit to Dr. Dave in Kleinmond,

who, because she was so ill, had been expecting her for a fortnight. We are always deeply moved by the compassion of all who work at the veterinary clinic; their love of animals evident in so many ways in all situations.

While George drove Abby to Kleinmond I shed many tears in the shower, having said a final goodbye earlier, and I suspect he fought back many tears while there, as well on the way home. She had been adopted from KAWS as a five month-old puppy, and immediately claimed our property as the domain over which she would rule for as long as she was able. She was the canine version of a mountain guide; the mountain path behind our home being her greatest challenge and delight, and led the way for all who desired to make the journey. She knew every rock that collected the rain water, and regularly drank at least one of them dry. Another favourite haunt was the riverside path at Palmiet, where she, her sister and friend would frolic and chase each other through the fynbos and over rocks and sea sand. She loved the beaches, but never chased or disturbed the birds. When we attended church services Abby stayed in the bakkie, but respectfully stood whenever the congregation rose to their feet to sing.

These, very briefly, were the two lives who touched others'. And those whose lives were touched opened their hearts to the bereaved. Some would say: "but Abby was only a dog!" and scoff, but they could never have experienced that unconditional love from an animal whose life became part of their own. Messages of condolence were sent from all over Betty's Bay, and we were touched by them all – it is true that we all expect condolence after a human passes away, but when they arrive after your pet departs this life, then it is a special kind of love.

People have wondered whether Jesus had a dog, and somehow I feel He must have, because I know He knows and understands what we, and all dog-lovers, are going through now. We know that He wept at the tomb of His friend, Lazarus, and His compassion drove Him to raise Lazarus from the dead. With Easter approaching, we remember Him making provision for His mother, by placing her in the care of John, just before He died on the cross. And we are urged, in Ephesians 4:32, to "Be kind and compassionate to one another", and 5:1: "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

As a recent recipient of this love and compassion, a deep-felt thank you to all who do! God bless.

Operation "Crime Feet"

Kleinmond Police together with the Betty's Bay Neighbourhood Watch recently launched Operation "Crime Feet". This operation is the brain child of W/O Jaco van Wyk and was first launched in Betty's Bay (a total of 1 000 pamphlets have been printed) and will shortly be launched in Kleinmond. This has been done in an effort to raise awareness to the rising crime in the area to not only the permanent residents, but to weekend and holiday visitors as well. These pamphlets will be handed out by Neighbourhood Watch Wardens to houses and businesses where negligence is evident. The public has continuously been warned to take the necessary safety precautions but to no avail. The idea behind this

operation is that when on patrol Wardens will issue a pamphlet where a car has been left unlocked/windows have been left open/valuables have been left in the car. Also where windows and doors of houses have been left open whilst the occupants are either upstairs or entertaining in the garden at the back of the house.

Should you receive such a pamphlet please ensure that you take the necessary precautions so as not to commit the same offence again. Remember we are only trying to make Betty's Bay a safer village for all.






